Smoke detectors are the first line of defence against a potential fire emergency. These small devices play a crucial role in keeping you safe by providing early warning to the presence of smoke or fire in your home. To ensure that your smoke detectors are in correct working condition, we carry out fire safety inspections every year. During the brief visit, our contractor Phoenix Fire Protection will test that your detectors, and any other fire equipment in your home are working correctly.
